Freshwater Teleost TAG seeks EEP Coordinators

The Regional Collection Plan for Freshwater Fishes is now published and the FWTAG is seeking EEP coordinators for the priority families of fish identified by the Regional Plan working group.

The families identified for collaborative management in Europe include a wide range of taxa, with several species already maintained in European aquariums and zoos. We now seek coordinators to lead the EEPs. At the RCP workshop in Amsterdam in 2019, we selected thirty families for EEP management. We would now like to find coordinators for at least five families to work with the TAG to develop the EEP structure.

What does an EEP Coordinator do?

- Acts as the contact point for information about their family connecting interested parties from across aquarium/zoo world and wider conservation community when possible
- Maintains an annual inventory of institutional (and private) holders for each species within the family. This inventory is kept up to date and made available to TAG members

- Identifies opportunities for conservation (both ex-situ and in-situ) for the species in their family
- Provides a short annual report on any news from the EEP or about the family they coordinate
- Forms part of the TAG's steering committee
